

**15. How We Passed A Sugary Beverage Tax With Revenue Dedicated Toward Access to Healthy Foods for Working Families in Seattle.**

Participants will learn why the SBT Coalition fought for passage of a Sugary Beverage Tax and how the Coalition won over the City of Seattle. They will learn how low income and working families and communities of color in Seattle can benefit from the revenue from the tax. The importance of healthy eating and food security will be discussed. The beverage industry is now fighting hard to overturn the tax. Learn about how the coalition is organizing to fight industry giants, hold the City of Seattle accountable and how you can participate.

**18. Holding Seattle Accountable.**

**19. Public Agency Contracting for DBE and MWBE Companies.**

The National Association of Minority Contractors and public agency representatives will discuss contracting opportunities for Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) and Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprise (MWBE) companies. The discussions will identify public agency legal requirements to provide contracting opportunities for DBE and MWBE companies and contract compliance processes. Agency representatives will also discuss where to find contracting opportunities and resources available to help interested DBE and MWBE companies participate in their procurement programs.
